The Rev. Dr. John W. Kleinig is professor emeritus at Luther College, Adelaide, SA, Australia. He holds the M.A. (1981) and the Ph.D. (1993) from Cambridge University and is the author of numerous articles and books, including two brilliant commentaries: *Leviticus* (CPH, 2003) and *Hebrews* (CPH, 2017). He has also written a masterful study of Christian spirituality, *Grace Upon Grace* (CPH, 2008). Dr. Kleinig serves on DOXOLOGY's Board of Advisors. John and his wife Claire (nee Bentley) have been blessed with four children and ten grandchildren.

The Rev. Dr. Gregory P. Schulz is Professor of Philosophy at Concordia University Wisconsin and has served over 30 years in the ministry. Colonel in the Civil Air Patrol where he has earned multiple achievement/teaching awards. Professor Schulz has lectured and presented academic papers at major universities stateside and abroad. He has also published theological and philosophical articles and reviews in a variety of professional and academic journals. Dr. Schulz continues to serve DOXOLOGY as a Senior Faculty Lecturer.

The Rev. Bryan Wolfmueller is the pastor at St. Paul and Jesus Deaf Lutheran Churches in Austin, TX. Prior to that, beginning in 2005, he served as the pastor of Hope Lutheran Church in Aurora, CO. He is the author of *Has American Christianity Failed?* (CPH, 2016) and *Final Victory: Contemplating the Death and Funeral of a Christian* (CPH, 2010). He is the co-host of Table Talk Radio podcast, and creator of Grappling with the Text, a weekly video Bible Study.
